### Advocacy

## **Notary Public**

From time to time, students require documents to be "certified" or "notarized," or to swear an oath before a Notary Public or Commissioner for Oaths. Notary Public services are available in nearby Humboldt through Thompson Travel Agency Ltd. (306-682-2422). Cost for notarized documents can range from \$10 to \$20.

## **Legal Services**

**Saskatchewan Legal Aid** provides legal assistance to people who cannot pay for a lawyer. The Student Services Office aims to serve as a guide to some of the academic policies and procedures that exist at St. Peter's College.
