Scholarships, Awards and Bursaries

There are numerous scholarships and awards available to students who attend St. Peter's College. While these awards encourage and reward scholastic achievement, life experience and College involvement, they also provide monetary assistance and help to facilitate attendance at the College.

The deadline to apply for St. Peter's College Scholarships, Awards and Bursaries is <u>June 20, 2024.</u> Successful applicants will be notified in **August.** St. Peter's College scholarships, awards and bursaries are presented to the recipients at the Annual Awards Day Ceremony on September 21, 2024. Students who win awards are expected to attend the ceremony as many donors come in person to meet the recipients.

For awards based on high school achievement, averages are calculated using university entrance requirements. All upper-year awards require completion of a minimum of 24 credit units at the university level, 18 of which must be St. Peter's College courses.

For entrance and returning awards, a student will be considered a full-time student if they are registered in a minimum of 18 credit units of St. Peter's College courses (9 credit units per term).

The scholarship committee reserves the right to not grant an award if criteria have not been met. The scholarship or bursary will be applied to the payment of the recipient's tuition and fees. Any remaining balance may be dispersed to the student and/or used for further academic purchases or fees the student has dependent on the scholarship conditions. Receipts may be required.

- St. Peter's College reserves the right to release recipient information and photos to donors, high schools, provincial funding bodies and the media. The College also reserves the right to use this information for promotional purposes.
- St. Peter's College assumes liability for the payment of scholarships, bursaries and other awards only to the extent that expected gifts from donors or returns from particular investments of endowed funds are realized. The College reserves the right to make whatever changes circumstances may require, including the cancellation or addition of particular awards.

Definitions

Credit Units: the amount of university-level credit to be awarded for successful completion of a course or, in the case of transfer credit, of study elsewhere. Frequent criterion used in judging credit units is the expected student effort in the course or hours of instruction. A class is typically 3 credit units. This is indicated by the number after the decimal in a course name. For example, SOC 111.3 is three credit units, ART 111.6 is six credit units.

Full-Time: a student will be considered full-time if they are registered in a minimum of 9 credit units per term of courses at St. Peter's College.

Returning Students: students who have completed at least one year of study at St. Peter's College and who are returning to study at St. Peter's College.

Preparing for School Budget Worksheet: the budget worksheet is a supporting document to provide students with the knowledge of their financial need. Within the St. Peter's College Scholarship application, you will be asked if you are in financial need. Use this worksheet to help you determine this factor. You may be asked to submit this document at a later time, so it is a good idea to have it completed before filling out the scholarship application.

Applying for Scholarships and Awards

- 2. Note that many of the awards require additional documentation such as letters of recommendation and authorized high school marks or transcripts. If you need to send additional documentations you will need to <u>label these</u> <u>documents with your first and last name on each one</u>, and submit on your application.
